

HEALTH SERVICES INFORMATION:

Immunizations--Students starting Kindergarten need to be current on their immunizations. When your child receives their immunizations please mail or drop them off at school so the dates can be entered in their chart before school starts.

Students entering 7th grade need the required DT, MMR & Hepatitis B injections. They also need proof that they have had the chicken-pox and if they have not, the chicken-pox vaccine is required. If they do not have these shots they will not be permitted to attend school until they receive their injections. Please refer to the immunization graph to make sure your child is current.

Sports physicals-- Students are required to have a sports physical every three years to participate in school sports. If your child is entering 7th grade and plans on participating in sports they will need a physical. Students entering 10th grade will also need a current sports physical. Alexandria Orthopedics will again be providing sports physical clinics at the Douglas County Hospital on July 31st and August 4th. You will need to register in advance to participate in the clinic. More information regarding the clinic will be in the Osakis Review & The Echo Press Newspaper. Mark your calendars for the annual Osakis Registration/Parent Information Meeting on Monday August 4th at 6:30 p.m. in the auditorium. This meeting must be attended by parents and all student/athletes entering grades 7 through 12 that plan to participate in a sport at some point during the 2008-2009 school year. Minnesota State High School League and Osakis permission forms will be filled out at that time. We will also be accepting fee payments.

Health Concerns--If your child develops any new health concerns during the summer months please let us know. We can best help your child here at school if we are aware of any health issues.

Medications--If your child requires a prescription medication during the school day permission from the parent and doctor is required. Clinics in the area have copies of our medication administration form and can mail or fax it to the school so I have it for the first day of school.
